DECEMBER 6 REMEMBERED

On December 6, 1989 fourteen women were killed in the Ecole Polytechnique in what has become known as the Montreal Massacre. The killer entered the engineering school, separated the women students from the men and opened fire, yelling "you're all a bunch of feminists."

This event has come to symbolize the violence and the threat of violence that women live with every day. Women in the West Kootenays are joining with others across Canada to organize events to commemorate the women who died in Montreal as well as the thousands of others who suffer violent attacks every year. December 6 has now been made a "National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women" by the Parliament of Canada.

At 7 p.m. on the evening of Friday, December 6, a candlelight vigil will be held in Nelson in front of the provincial government building on Ward Street. In Castlegar, there will be a vigil at 6 p.m. at Castlegar City Hall.

The women in Montreal were killed simply because they were women, women who wanted to become engineers. "But the violent attacks on women occur whether or not they are stepping out of their traditional roles. The Montreal Massacre has made Canadians more aware of the reality of violence that women experience," said Sam Simpson, Coordinator of the Nelson and District Women's Centre. "It's important to us that this is a Day of Action as well as a Day of Remembrance. We hope all area residents will come to the memorial gatherings as well as joining in the work to end the violence in women's lives."
